Partnership for an AIDS-Free Generation

The U.S. President’s Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) proudly supports Mozambique’s fight against HIV/AIDS. To date the country has received approximately \$1.3 billion in PEPFAR funding and supports treatment for every three of four individuals living with HIV/AIDS in Mozambique. With an adult prevalence rate of 11.5 %, these investments support evidence-based interventions in pursuit of an AIDS-free generation, including HIV testing and counseling, voluntary medical male circumcision, the provision of antiretroviral treatment, clinical and community-based care for people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA), and more.

In FY12, PEPFAR-supported activities in all 11 provinces of Mozambique achieved the following results:

- Anti-retroviral therapy (ART) for **242,700** individuals
- **79,000** voluntary medical male circumcision procedures
- Anti-retroviral prophylaxis for **87,600** pregnant women to prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV
- HIV testing and counseling for more than **2.1 million** people
- Care and support to **662,600** Mozambicans, including **197,700** orphans and vulnerable children
- Training for greater than **6,900** community health workers
- Direct support to **293** treatment sites, **736** PMTCT sites and **15** male circumcision sites

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
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PEPFAR Mozambique supports Mozambique's National Strategic Plan through the Partnership Framework Implementation Plan. The Governments of Mozambique and the United States collaborate to strengthen Mozambique's national HIV/AIDS response through the following principles: government commitment and ownership, coordination, decentralization, health system strengthening, transparency, accountability and results-based management.

PEPFAR implementation is managed by committed American and Mozambican technical staff from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), the Department of State (DOS), the Department of Defense (DOD), and staff and volunteers of the U.S. Peace Corps (PC). Together with hundreds of local and international partners across Mozambique, these men and women work to prevent new infections, provide treatment to those already ill, and support those affected by HIV and AIDS.
