

# The Secretary's Vision

Secretary Clinton is placing economics and market forces at the center of U.S. foreign policy. Economic Statecraft means both harnessing global economic forces to advance America's foreign policy and employing the tools of foreign policy to shore up our economic strength.

Global Economic Statecraft Day is a global event we are holding on June 14th to highlight America's commitment to put economics at the center of our foreign policy and to use diplomacy to advance America's economic renewal. Economic forces, from the eurozone crisis to the transitions in the Middle East and North Africa, shape our foreign policy choices as never before.
