

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND

- Keep your passport in a safe place. Make a good, clear copy of your passport to bring with you to the festival. This makes it less likely that your actual passport will be lost or stolen.
- While at Oktoberfest, keep your passport copy, cell phone, money, and hotel address on your person, and preferably in a secure pouch or pocket.
- Taking beer mugs from the Oktoberfest tents is considered a criminal offense. You can purchase official mugs, that are approved to leave the grounds, from vendors.
- Don't forget – Bavarian beer is much stronger than American beer! Drinking a "Maß" (one liter of beer) has the same alcohol content as a six-pack of American beer.
- Please note: The Bavarian authorities have a zero tolerance policy on illegal drugs.

WHAT TO DO IF...

- **You lose your passport:**
Apply for a replacement at the Consulate (see reverse for directions). You will need to bring at least \$135 (or Euro equivalent), a passport photo, and whatever picture ID you have.
- **You lose your money:**
Contact your family/friends and ask them to send you money via Western Union. Transfers can be made 24/7 online at www.westernunion.com.
You can pick up the money either at a Reisebank (located at major train stations or airports) or at the German post office.
- **You lose your credit card:**
Call your credit card company to report it lost or stolen :

⇒ **AMEX**: +1-336-393-1111 (USA)

AT OKTOBERFEST (THERESIENWIESE):

- **Police and Red Cross** are both located at the **Servicezentrum** (behind the **Schottenhamel** tent).
- **The Lost & Found** is located at the Service Center basement, the entrance is in the "**Festleitung**". It is open daily from **Sept 19 to Oct 4** from **1pm - 11pm**. They CANNOT be contacted by telephone, only in person or by e-mail, at Fundbuero.kvr@muenchen.de

Sichere Wiesn: Security Point for Women and Girls:

- If you feel threatened or harassed, or if you simply need information, help or advice, visit the **Sichere Wiesn Security Point** located below the Bavaria statue in the Service Center (see reverse). It is open daily from **6pm - 1am**, and every **Saturday** from **3pm - 1am**.



The American Consulate General is a short walk from the **Odeonsplatz subway station**.


At the Odeonsplatz Station, take **exit C** and walk straight on **Ludwigstrasse to von-der-Tann Strasse**.
