Advanced TESOL Course: Connecting learning and Teaching in the 21st Century

In this month long course teachers will confront and delve into the reality that the traditional role of teacher as informants, disciplinarian and information managers, while still part of a teachers' job, are no longer sufficient for learning in the 21st century. We will consider complexity theory, current theories about second language acquisition, and learning in general that include but are not limited to constructive-developmental theory, situated learning theory, learning through experience, and transformative learning theory. We will discuss and use a variety of forms of technology in both our teaching and our reflecting. We will work on how planning, teaching and reflection with particular attention to these theories can significantly impact learning in the English language classroom.

This course is appropriate for all experienced teachers who have a firm understanding of how to plan, teach and reflect on lessons based on second language acquisition theory and who are ready to incorporate more complex theoretical concepts and more technology into their teaching practice.

The course provides practical training through reading, classroom discussions, teaching demonstrations, lesson planning and analysis, and practice teaching and feedback. Participants refine skills in teaching, speaking, listening, reading, writing, grammar and culture and develop skills in implementing situated learning theory, learning through experience, constructive developmental theory and transformative learning theory. The course begins with a brief review of second language acquisition and its application in the classroom and then focuses on how current learning theories can support language learning and teaching. Participants examine specific teaching areas each day, which they apply in their daily practice teaching of adult ESOL learners. Participants gain skills in analysis through examining their lessons with trainers. There is a maximum trainer-participant ratio of 7 to 1.

Entry Requirements

In order to be accepted into the Certificate course, applicants must:

- 1) Possess a high school diploma.
- 2) Demonstrate a clear interest in teaching ESOL and have taught for at least five years.
- 3) Demonstrate the ability to plan both productive and receptive skill lessons based on a chosen framework or set of criteria.
- 4) Have an ability to focus on student learning and reflect upon the impact of one's own teaching.
- 5) Have a positive attitude regarding experiential activities and working in groups. This means that you are not only willing to fully participate in such activities, but also recognize the value in doing so.

- 6) Demonstrate English language proficiency (CI level on the CEF or TOEFL 550 non-native speakers)
- 7) Complete the application form and a short essay.
- 8) Complete an informal phone interview (s).

Key factors for interview:

- Educational background, dedication to teaching English
- Appropriateness of the course for the applicant's needs/goals
- Applicants' ability to design productive and receptive skill lessons.
- Attitude regarding reflection, experiential and collaborative learning, and group work
- Language proficiency

Attendance Policy

- Participants are expected to attend all course sessions. Those who know in advance that they are unable to attend the whole course cannot be accepted. Participants should understand that the course is a full time endeavor. In order to complete the demands of the course successfully, participants should not expect to be able to work or attend to other commitments during the course.
- In the event of a serious illness or emergency, participants should notify a trainer as soon as possible. The participant must make up all missed work and practice teaching.
- The first full two days of the course cannot be missed. If this should occur, the participant must withdraw.
- If the participant must take a prolonged absence (more than two days) s/he must withdraw from the course.
- Attendance only is not a guarantee that the certificate will be issued. Participants must fulfill the requirements of the course in order to receive the certificate.
