## Drug Test Kits for Panama Units

### 1. DESCRIPTION

The Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs (INL) is an instrumental leader in the development of policies and programs to combat international narcotics and crime. INL programs support two of the Department of States' strategic goals: (1) to reduce the entry of illegal drugs into the United States; and (2) to minimize the impact of international crime on the United States and its citizens. One of the many ways to effectively meet the listed goals is to collaborate with allied governments both directly and indirectly to promote the modernization of and support the enforcement operations of their foreign criminal justice systems and law enforcement agencies.

INL of the Embassy of the United States of America in Panama was established in 1991. INL receives program orientation information, support, and financing from the Bureau for International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs (INL), the executive agency assigned the mission of reducing illicit drug flows to the U.S. INL provides direction in anti-narcotic policies and strategy to the Ambassador and special project support to other U.S. Embassy and government agencies. INL also provides funding, operations, training and logistical supports for Panamanian counter narcotics and law enforcement institutions.

This equipment will be used to test luggage and cargo during on/off loading onto commercial aircraft at Tocumen International Airport and others. This equipment will support our Vetted Unit ongoing mission to stop the flow of illegal narcotics and substances from source countries into the U.S. and other countries. DEA will assist SIU/DNAD Panama and SENAFRONT in the use and implementation to better serve the mission.

### 2. REQUIRED ITEMS:

The Contractor shall provide to the U.S. Government the new vehicle as described on this RFQ for the stated firm fixed price. Further, the Contractor shall properly perform the pre-delivery inspection on the vehicles and deliver them to the location set forth in Section below (Place of Delivery), of this contract. The IDIQ shall include the vehicles, pre-delivery inspection, and certificates of origin, operator's manuals and warranty certificates.

Description or Item details:

- DRUG TEST KITS FOR COCAINE
- DRUG TEST KITS FOR HEROIN
- DRUG TEST KITS FOR MARIJUANA

It is a yearly contract with one option year to choose, considering 5,000 packages (50,000 units) for Crack (Cocaine), 1,000 packages (10,000 units) for Heroin, and 1,000 packages (10,000 units) for Marijuana. See details in the RFQ posted.

## GENERAL CONDITIONS AND TERMS

**FACTORY WARRANTY:** Factory warranty of one year parts throughout the items from the date of shipment (13 months) in total. Damage due to misuse, abuse, manipulation or force majeure is not covered.

### 3. DELIVERY INFORMATION

**Delivery Date:** FOB Destination. Delivery will be approximately 15 days after receipt of award. The Contractor shall consolidate the entire shipment to prevent loss and misdirection. Any lost or damaged items during shipment shall be replaced by the contractor upon notification. When the order is ready for shipment, forward the shipment prepaid directly to:
