

Security Message for U.S. Citizens – Protests and Roadblocks in Paraguay
U.S. Embassy Asuncion, Paraguay
June 27, 2012

The U.S. Embassy advises U.S. citizens that road closures and protests are possible throughout Paraguay beginning Wednesday, June 27. Members of "Frente Guazu" are threatening to initiate protests due to the recent political events in Paraguay. Major routes and bridges could be blocked intermittently. News media report that route closures will occur in the Department of Paraguari, in the towns of Caapucu, Mbuyapey, La Colmena, Quiindy, Ybycui, Carapegua, Yaguaron along the route from Paraguari to Villarrica, in the Department of Misiones, in the town of Cruce Santa Maria, and along Route 1. You should anticipate congestion and longer travel times. These demonstrations are expected to continue through the weekend.

The situation remains fluid, and the eventual dimension and details of the anticipated protests remain uncertain at this time. While there are currently no anticipated road closures in Asuncion, you should consider avoiding the downtown area for the next few days. Information about the location and other details of protest activity is available from a variety of sources, including the local media.

U.S. citizens are strongly urged to avoid any large gatherings or events where crowds have congregated. While demonstrations and protests are generally peaceful in Paraguay, they can turn violent quickly. If you find yourself near a demonstration or protest, leave the area immediately.

U.S. citizens who travel to or reside in Paraguay are encouraged to enroll in the [State Department's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program \(STEP\)](#). U.S. citizens without internet access may enroll directly with the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate. By enrolling, you make it easier for the U.S. Embassy or Consulate to contact you in case of an emergency.
