The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) in Lima, Peru is seeking applications for the following position:

Position Title: Project Management Specialist

Pos. No. and Grade: FSN 12, C-537

Division/Office: Economic Growth and Environment (EGE) Office

BASIC FUNCTION OF POSITION

This position is the "Amazon" senior technical advisor for the South America Regional Environmental Program (SAR-Env), including the Initiative for Conservation in the Andean Amazon (ICAA). ICAA is the flagship regional biodiversity conservation program of USAID/LAC. ICAA builds capacity for biodiversity conservation, reduced deforestation, improved natural resource management, strengthened environmental governance and payments for environmental services. The program operates in the Amazon regions of Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador and Peru and coordinates closely with those Mission bilateral programs and with other USAID-funded programs. This position requires the ability to work closely with NGOs and host country government agencies throughout the region, both regional vision and engagement on key conservation issues, and the ability to effectively manage multiple/complex institutional relationships across sectors.

MAJOR DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Management of SAR-Env Mechanisms:
As a member of the SAR-Env team function as Agreement Officer's Technical Representative (AOTR) and/or Contract Officer's Technical Representative (COTR) and/or Activity Manager of grant(s), cooperative agreement(s) and contract(s), as assigned. This includes:
 - a. designing and procuring SAR-Env activities in a team-based approach with the Mission and across the region,
 - b. approving key personnel, annual work plans, travel and budgets/expenditures as appropriate,
 - c. overseeing activity performance, including reviewing/accepting reports and site visits, and
 - d. operating effectively as an SAR-Env team member, sharing information

and coordinating closely with PMU team members and Mission technical staff in the region to ensure complementarities and value-added of USAID programs.

2. Initiative-wide Management:

As a member of the SAR-Env Team, function effectively as a team member with assigned responsibilities to include:

- a. negotiating and managing Initiative-wide tasks and activities as a member of the PMU such as shared responsibilities for data quality, financial management, reporting, communications, networking, participation in SAR-Env-wide training and other events, and joint site visits,
 - specifically, providing region-wide budgetary and/or performance data management functions within the team, as assigned,
 - specifically, writing and/or reviewing required Annual Environmental Reports, including the GCC report, Tropical Forestry and Biodiversity (118-119 FAA), ICAA-wide Annual Report and Outlook, USAID Amazon-wide Conservation report, ICAA briefing papers and talking points, and others to be determined.
- b. coordinating activities with other members of the team, including ensuring complementarities and value-added with other SAR-Env components, USAID bilateral activities managed by Amazon region Missions, other USAID programs, other donors and partners, and
- c. proactively communicating, sharing information and collaborating within the SAR-Env team, with other Missions within the USAID Amazon Conservation Working Group and with other cross-sectorial USAID colleagues to ensure maximum program impact.

3. Technical Leadership:

Serve as technical advisor for the SAR-Env team. Advise on the conceptualization and evaluation of regional biodiversity conservation, integrated watershed management, environmental governance, climate change and other related issues and activities in SAR-Env's purview. Serve as a liaison with national environmental authorities, other Missions, environmental organizations, industry, the academic sector, and other donors on environmental issues. Identify and assess conservation problems in the Andean Amazon, their potential solutions and identify priority sectors for activity implementation, including creative cross-sectorial and private sector opportunities. Promote share lessons learned within the broader conservation and development community, including public presentations and professional development opportunities related to Amazon conservation. Represent SAR-Env and its programming to Missions and USG agencies and officials, including coordinating site visits with USG officials.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Education:

A minimum of a Master's Degree in Environmental Studies, Biology, Ecology, Integrated Sustainable Development, or similar field is required. A degree from a U.S. or internationally-accredited university is preferable.

Prior Work Experience:

A minimum of ten (10+) years of progressively more responsible experience in the Andean Amazon region (preferably more than one country-not just Peru) in environmental issues, including environmental governance, biodiversity conservation, climate change, community-based conservation with indigenous groups and other environmental issues is required.

Post Entry Training:

Training in USAID policy, rules and regulations (C/AOTR certification), and in special program areas related to assigned duties when available.

Language Proficiency:

Level IV (fluent) in English reading and writing, and equivalent in Spanish is required.

Knowledge:

Sound knowledge of the region's environmental problems and development priorities is required.

Abilities and Skills:

Competence, experience, and maturity in dealing with regional government officials and international organizations. Ability to identify significant economic, political, and social trends in the region and assess their importance and potential impacts on USAID development assistance objectives and projects. Ability to function effectively in team-based settings, both in daily program implementation and in inter-agency working groups. Proven skills in working on transnational and transboundary issues. Proven skills to work effectively in cross-cultural situations and in highly charged political environments. Ability to obtain, analyze, and evaluate data and present it in meaningful terms. Strong communications skills both orally and in writing. Ability to follow through on USAID project management issues and serve as point of contact for South America as well as U.S. counterparts. Familiarity with USAID regulations and contracting procedures.
