The enclosed information pertains to your interest in immigrating to the United States. We confirm that you are now eligible to schedule your formal visa interview.

There are several steps that you must follow. The first is the MRV fee payment which must be done online with an electronic funds transfer (EFT) directly from your Internet bank account (only if you have an Internet Bank Account in Poland) or in person at the Bank Pocztowy in Poland. Please follow the link www.ustraveldocs.com/pl/pl-niv-paymentinfo.asp for instructions on paying the visa application fee.

Immediately after you pay your application fee online, or the day after you have paid in person at Bank Pocztowy, you will be eligible to schedule your fiancé visa appointment online at www.ustraveldocs.com Additionally, during the scheduling process on this same website please choose the visa pick-up location (TNT courier office), print the confirmation page with your TNT office choice, and bring it with you for the visa interview. All members of your family immigrating with you, except children under 14, must appear with you on the scheduled appointment date.

Bring all documents pertaining to your case with you on your appointment date. You must present your original documents in this order when you appear for your visa interview.

1. Passport with at least 8 months' validity beyond the issuance date of the visa.
2. Original of the full birth certificate for each applicant.
3. Original of the full marriage certificate, if applicable.
4. Termination of prior marriages (divorce decree, death certificate of the spouse, annulment of marriage), if applicable.
5. Two (2) photographs signed on back with the last and first name for each visa applicant. Photographs must be taken within the last six months. For more information on photo requirements, please check our website: <http://poland.usembassy.gov>
6. Police certificate. Applicants aged 16 years or over must submit a police certificate from the police authorities of the country of the applicant's nationality or current residence where the applicant has resided for at least six months since age 16. Police certificates are also required from all other countries where the applicant has resided for **at least one year**. A police certificate must also be obtained from the police authorities of any place where the applicant has been arrested for any reason, regardless of how long he or she lived there. Police certificates must cover the entire period of the applicant's residence in any area. A police certificate must be of recent date when presented to the consular officer and cannot be older than 12 months from the date of issuance. 7. Court and prison records, if applicable (with a translation into English).
8. Military records – the original and a translation of any military record (for applicants from Belarus).
9. Affidavit of Support: signed I-134 Form accompanied by a bank statement and job letter (optional, but recommended).
10. Form DS-160 Nonimmigrant Visa Electronic Application for each applicant completed in English at the Consular Electronic Application Center at <http://ceac.state.gov> More information on filing the forms is available at http://travel.state.gov/visa/forms/forms_4230.html
11. Proof of your relationship with your fiancé (letters, telephone bills, photographs, airline tickets, etc.).
12. Results of the medical examination. All applicants, regardless of age, must undergo medical examinations by an Embassy-designated panel physician. Maximum validity of medical examinations is 6 months and therefore your visa will be limited to the validity of the exam. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

If an applicant is found ineligible for a visa, the visa application processing fee cannot be refunded or transferred.

All documents not issued officially in English or Polish must be translated into English by a certified translator. Please note that the Embassy may request other documents be translated as well.

If you wish to retain an original birth certificate and/or marriage certificate, you may submit a photocopy but you must bring the original for inspection by the consular officer. We advise you to keep a duplicate copy of all documents submitted in connection with your visa application. The Embassy does not keep copies of your documents that are included in the visa packet.

THE EMBASSY CANNOT GUARANTEE VISA ISSUANCE AHEAD OF TIME.

No assurance can be given in advance that a visa will be issued. A consular officer can make a decision only after you have signed your formal application, been personally interviewed by that officer and your documents and the results of your medical examination reviewed. The American Embassy makes every effort to quickly adjudicate your visa application, but sometimes the adjudicating process may require more than one visit to the Embassy, therefore you may consider applying for a multiple-entry Schengen visa. Applicants will pick up their visas at their chosen TNT courier location.

We advise you not to make any travel arrangements for departure from your country, not to dispose of your property or give up your job until the visa has been issued to you. A fiancé visa is limited by the validity of medical examination and may not exceed six months. You must enter the United States within this period.

Petitions for K visas are valid for four months only. Beyond that, a consular officer must agree to extend the validity of the petition to continue with case processing.
