

**1.0 GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT**

This project is a series of professional development workshops delivered to alumni of U.S. Government-sponsored exchange programs. The Fulbright program is the oldest and most well-known, but there are a variety of others, including the International Visitor Leadership Program. There are approximately 3,000 Portuguese alumni of these programs, in all walks of life, working and living throughout continental Portugal as well as the Azores and Madeira.

Workshop 4 (Coimbra)      Conflict Resolution and Negotiation.

**1.1 Goals of Professional Development Workshop Training Series**

A) The goals of the project are to reengage with alumni; increase networking among diverse groups of alumni; and create a cohort of leaders in the alumni community.

B) Provide for both the personal and professional development of alumni through soft skill and leadership development in a format that encourages dialogue, self-reflection and cross cultural interaction.

C) Identify groups of alumni that are committed to working together to give something back to society. Create synergies so that alumni are prepared to apply for grants (such as the Alumni Innovation Engagement Fund) to further those goals.

**1.2 Project Timeline (approximate dates, subject to alteration)**

January-March, 2013: Conflict Resolution and Negotiation.

**2.0 PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT**

The Service Providers shall deliver the workshop in English focused on Conflict Resolution and Negotiation. Each workshop shall last 5-8 hours on a Saturday, with the minimum time per workshop being five hours. The Service providers will present this workshop sometime in January-March, 2014 on a date specified by the U. S. Government.

## **2.1 Participants**

The workshop will have approximately 20-30 participants. The participants will be drawn from the ranks of alumni of U.S. Government-funded exchange programs, including the Fulbright program, as well as Embassy staff, Fulbright Commission staff and the staff from the American Corners in Portugal. They may also include American Fulbright students/scholars who will be studying in Portugal at the time of the workshops.

## **2.2 Logistics and organization of the workshops**

Invitations, scheduling facilities, and organizing the venues, as well as the logistics at the venue will be handled by the Embassy and its local partners, most notably, the University of Coimbra. Contractors will only be required to provide trainer(s) and all training material.

## **2.3 Locations**

The workshop will take place at the University of Coimbra. The locations and spaces where the workshop will be held will be arranged by the Embassy, in conjunction with university partners, with the Embassy and its partners responsible for logistics associated with the setup of the venues.

The American Corners program, which is managed by the Department of State through Embassy Lisbon, exists in 7 locations in Portugal where the U.S. Embassy and local institutions have joined together to create areas where visitors can find information about the U.S. and world events.
