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

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## MISSION

The English Language Office (ELO) opened in the U.S. Embassy in Moscow in 1993. Part of the Public Affairs Section, it cooperates with the Ministry of Education, teachers' associations, universities, schools and English language teaching (ELT) professionals on a variety of educational and cultural exchange programs and projects in order to enhance mutual understanding between the peoples of the Russian Federation and the United States.

The office in Moscow is one of 18 such offices around the world. Its work is coordinated by the Office of English Language Programs in the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs in Washington, D.C. The English Language Office is committed to building and strengthening professional development opportunities offered by national and regional Teachers' Associations, such as NATE, SPELTA and FEELTA, and by pre-service and in-service training programs, such as those offered by pedagogical universities and retraining institutes. The ELO supports conferences, workshop series and consultations that address methodology, curriculum design, assessment and materials development needs. Professional exchanges, such as the English Language Fellow, English Language Specialist, and International Visitor programs, online courses and resources, and English language materials are among the ways in which the ELO works with the ELT community.



## PROGRAMS

The English Language Fellow Program (ELF) program places highly qualified American ELT professionals in host institutions and universities throughout the Russian Federation for one to two academic years. Fellows work with their hosts as well as with the local and regional ELT community, creating professional development opportunities and supporting collaboration between teachers' associations, local ministry of education offices and teachers at all levels.



The English Language Specialist Program brings American ELT experts to the Russian Federation for two to three weeks to address cutting-edge aspects of relevant themes and topics, such as teaching English for Specific Purposes, Computer Assisted Language Learning, and alternative assessment. Specialists provide keynote addresses at conferences, conduct workshops and consult with a wide range of ELT professionals.

The English Access Microscholarship Program is the U.S. Department of State initiative for secondary school students. ## RESOURCES

The English Language Office coordinates the distribution of U.S. government-produced ELT and American studies books, cassettes, maps, videos and CDs. Its flagship publication, the quarterly *English Teaching Forum*, is a response to a need for theoretical and practical solutions and suggestions in the ELT field. New and experienced authors are encouraged to contribute their articles. The ELO also collaborates with local authors to create Russia-specific material that addresses key ELT and cross-cultural issues.

The Umbrella Newsletter is an online newsletter that is sent to thousands of ELT practitioners throughout the Russian Federation. It contains information on local and national professional development opportunities, including conferences and exchange programs. Members share news items and contribute to the Calendar of ELT Events.

E-Teacher, a suite of online courses on Assessment, Young Learners, English for Specific Purposes, Critical Thinking, etc are offered annually. The ELO also sponsors a group of participants for the online courses *Integrating the Internet into the Classroom* and *Exploring Web 2.0*, which provide participants with practical approaches to applying internet technology in their ELT courses.
