OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL CULTURAL SERVICE SCHOLARSHIPS

Oregon State welcomes a diverse student body of over 26,000 students from across Oregon, all 50 states and more than 100 countries. They can choose from more than 200 undergraduate and more than 80 graduate degree programs, including over 30 degrees online offered through Oregon State Ecampus. Oregon State increasingly attracts high-achieving students, with nationally recognized programs in areas such as conservation biology, agricultural sciences, nuclear engineering, forestry, fisheries and wildlife management, community health, pharmacy and zoology.



The International Cultural Service Program (ICSP) scholarship is available to students who are fully admitted to a bachelor's, master's or PhD program at OSU. Post-baccalaureate applicants and applicants who are offered conditional admission based on their TOEFL or IELTS test scores are ineligible. You must be able to show sufficient evidence of funding to support your education minus the proposed ICSP award amount before you can be considered.

Minnesota State University, Mankato is where tireless thought and innovative research bring real solutions to real needs. The University's environment of big ideas coupled with real-world thinking equip Minnesota State Mankato students to go well beyond expectations and into exciting, rewarding futures.



The Cultural Contribution scholarship is automatically awarded to all new international undergraduate students, allowing them to pay resident tuition rates for a savings of \$7000+ per academic year. With the scholarship, international undergraduate students pay approximately \$7532 per year in tuition and fees. Students must meet criteria to maintain the scholarship beyond the first semester.

BRANDEIS UNIVERSITY MERIT- AND NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS



The Graduate School of Arts and Sciences is one of four graduate schools on campus; due to the relatively small size of the graduate programs, our faculty and staff members are able to give individualized attention to ensure that students receive rigorous training and mentored support as they master a discipline and prepare for future careers. Faculty members are honored annually with Fulbright and Guggenheim Fellowships, National Institutes of Health and other national and international awards, professional memberships and National Science Foundation Grants. Several faculty members are recipients of the MacArthur Fellowship, also known as a “Genius Grant.”

To help students make graduate school possible for students in our two-year program, Brandeis makes available special scholarships, based on merit and need. The typical award for a two-year computational linguistics master's students is a 50% tuition scholarship.

PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES TO OFFER FREE ONLINE CLASSES FOR CREDIT

In an unusual arrangement with a commercial company, dozens of public universities plan to offer an introductory online course free and for credit to anyone worldwide, in the hope that those who pass will pay tuition to complete a degree program.

The universities — including Arizona State, the University of Cincinnati and the University of Arkansas system — will choose which of their existing online courses to convert to a massive open online course, or MOOC, in the new program, called MOOC2Degree.

TUFTS JOINS BERKELEY IN APPLICATION SURGE FROM FOREIGN STUDENTS



At Tufts University, international applications climbed 12 percent from a year ago and have more than doubled since 2004. The number of foreign students seeking admission to the University of California, Berkeley jumped about 22 percent this year, while the University of Pennsylvania, an Ivy League member, reported a 38 percent increase since 2010.

“Having students from overseas just makes sense,” said Lee Coffin, dean of undergraduate admission at Medford, Massachusetts-based Tufts. “If the American population is going to decline, then the global population represents another source of high-quality students.”


Valentine's Day is celebrated in a very similar manner across the United States, but it varies when it comes to other countries.
