Routine Message for U.S. Citizens

U.S. Embassy Dakar notifies all U.S. citizens residing in its consular district that the U.S Liaison Office in Bissau (BLO) will re-open on Monday (June 17, 2013). Owing to the size of the BLO, all security and consular services are currently being coordinated through the American Citizens Services Section and the Regional Security Office at the U.S. Embassy in Dakar, Senegal.

U.S. citizens living in and traveling to Guinea-Bissau are encouraged to practice good personal security habits and be aware of their surroundings by remaining vigilant and taking appropriate steps to increase their personal security.
