

Global Entry Program for U.S. Citizens and LPRs residing in Singapore

Global Entry is a CBP program that allows expedited clearance for pre-approved, low-risk travelers upon arrival in the United States. Though intended for frequent international travelers, there is no minimum number of trips necessary to qualify for the program. Participants may enter the United States by using automated kiosks located at select airports. Global Entry is currently available at 34 U.S. airports, as well as 8 Preclearance airports in Canada, and 2 Preclearance sites in Ireland.

Global Entry is designed to be quick, efficient and, at the same time, provide added security for international travelers. While Global Entry's goal is to speed travelers through the process, members are still subject to the same laws and regulations as other travelers, and may be selected for further examination at any time when entering the United States.

U.S. Embassy Singapore is **not** an official Enrollment center for the Global Entry program, we provide **Global Entry Interviews** at the Embassy as an accommodation, subject to **terms and conditions (*)** applied below.

*** You must be a U.S. Citizen or Lawful Permanent Resident (LPR). You can apply for your children under the age of 18, but they must be accompanied by at least one parent or legal guardian at the interview.**

*** You are legally residing in Singapore and have encountered difficulties in arranging or completing an interview at the U.S. airports.**

*** You must complete the following actions, before you put up a request for an interview appointment at the U.S. Embassy Singapore:**

- ✓ You have submitted the Global Online Enrollment System (GOES) application and have paid the USD 100 non-refundable application fee**
- ✓ You have obtained the conditional approval letter notification and an application ID.**
- ✓ You have scheduled an appointment online at one of the U.S. Enrollment centers within 30 days of being conditionally approved.**

****Please take note:***

The action of scheduling an online appointment needs to be completed within 30 days of being conditionally approved, as the Global Entry system will auto-cancel the application if an online appointment has not been made at one of the U.S. Enrollment centers.

The appointment date you have scheduled online at any of the U.S. enrollment center, is recommended to be 2-3 months away from the day you submit your Global Entry Interview Request form. Your application must stay valid in the Global Entry system until you are granted and have completed your interview at the U.S. Embassy Singapore.

If you **meet the above stated terms and conditions**, and wish to apply for an interview appointment at the U.S. Embassy Singapore; please download and complete the **[Global Entry Interview Request Form](#)**. Then please submit the request form via email to **globalentrysingapore@state.gov**.

Interview appointment requests will be considered and granted on a case-by-case basis. Interview slots at the U.S. Embassy Singapore will be limited to **Wednesday mornings from 9am to 12noon**.

At the interview, a U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officer will ask you questions, take your photo, and collect biometric information, e.g., scan your fingerprints.

When a CBP officer approves or denies your application upon completion of the interview at the U.S. Embassy Singapore, Global Online Enrollment System (**[GOES](#)**) auto cancels any scheduled U.S. airport appointments online.

What you need to bring to the interview:

- U.S. Citizens must bring your valid U.S. passport (or passports if you have more than one). If you are a Lawful Permanent Resident (LPR), you must present your permanent resident card (green card).
- Each Interviewee is required to bring an additional photo ID card (such as a driver's license or any photo ID) to exchange for a temporary entry badge at the Embassy security guard desk, before you step into the Embassy lobby. Children will show their passport ID at the guard posts and will keep their passports for the Global Entry Interview.
- Families will be interviewed in one meeting as children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by at least one guardian or parent who has legal custody of the children, and are required to provide copies of the legal custody documents (e.g. Birth Certificate, Notarized letter etc.).
