## **MELLON RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS 2011**

*Three Fellowships for Scholars from  
Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary,  
Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, and Slovakia*

**Field of Study:** Any field of classical studies, e.g., archaeology, art, history, epigraphy, or philology, or post-classical studies, e.g., Byzantine, post-Byzantine.

**Those Eligible:** Scholars with the Ph.D. or equivalent. Preference will be given to first-time applicants, but past fellows are also eligible to apply.

**Purpose:** To encourage scholars who have had little or no opportunity to study in Greece. Mellon Research Fellowships are funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation through a grant to the Council of American Overseas Research Centers. This is the final year of funding for this program.

**Duration:** Three consecutive months, between early January 2011 and June 30, 2011.

**Terms:** Cash stipend per Fellowship of \$14,100 and waiver of School fees. All expenses are to be paid from the stipend including room, board, travel. Housing may not be available at the ASCSA. A final report is due at the end of the award period, and the ASCSA expects that copies of all publications that result from research conducted as a Fellow of the ASCSA be contributed to the relevant library of the School.

**Application:** All application materials must be received by **December 1, 2010**. Submit Associate Membership application (long form) on the ASCSA web site at [www.ascsa.edu.gr](http://www.ascsa.edu.gr). The application should include *curriculum vitae*, statement of the project (up to three pages in length) stating the importance of the research and the necessity for conducting it at the American School, two letters of reference from scholars in the field commenting on the value and feasibility of the project. Applications will be read by the academic staff of the American School, with particular weight being given to the project statement.
