The Humphrey Fellowship Program brings accomplished mid-level professionals from around the world to the United States for a year of study and professional development. Fellowships are awarded competitively to candidates with excellent academic and professional qualifications as well as a commitment to public service. Fellowships are available in the following fields: Law and Human Rights, Trafficking in Persons Policy and Prevention, Economic Development, HIV/AIDS Policy and Prevention, Journalism, Education, Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment, Public Administration, Environmental Management and Public Health. **The Humphrey Fellowship is a non-degree program.**

Candidates should be Swazi citizens between the ages of 30 and 50. Applicants must hold an undergraduate degree (4 years of university), and have five years of substantial professional experience, demonstrated leadership, as well as be proficient in English.

Interested candidates **must** attend one of two briefings: **Monday, December 9 at 12:30 PM; Tuesday, December 10 at 12:30 PM.** The briefings will be held at the Public Diplomacy Section, Corner Sir Robert Croydon Avenue and Jubela Street, Kent Rock area, Mbabane. Application forms will be sent to attendees via email following the briefing and Q&A. **Please bring a pen and ensure that you have a working email address.**
