### **BASIC FUNCTION OF POSITION**

The incumbent is a Roving Secretary assigned to the Regional Human Resources Office, but serving in all Embassy section offices, including the Front Office, on a rotating basis to cover staffing shortages. S/he reports to the Regional Human Resources Officer. Embassy Bangkok's Roving Secretary program exists to provide assistance in covering U.S. Direct-Hire Office Management Specialist (OMS) and Eligible Family Member (EFM) Office Management Assistant (OMA) vacancies throughout the Embassy resulting from planned leave, staffing gaps, medical emergencies, and other contingencies.

### **QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED**

- Sister or brother (including stepsisters and stepbrothers, or adoptive sisters or brothers) of the employee, spouse, or same-sex domestic partner when such sibling is at least 51 percent dependent on the employee for support, unmarried, and under 21 years of age, or regardless of age, incapable of self-support; **and**
- Listed on the travel orders or approved Form OF-126 of a sponsoring employee, i.e., a direct-hire Foreign Service, Civil Service, or uniformed service member who is

permanently assigned to or stationed abroad or, as appropriate, at an office of the American Institute in Taiwan; **and**

- Is under chief of mission authority.
