

ITEM REQUIRED	SECONDARY EVIDENCE ACCEPTED
Original Thai Birth Certificate	<p>Must provide all three of these:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Certificate of Birth Place. This certificate can be obtained at a local district or Amphoe where your recorded official house registration is. 2. Current Thai ID 3. Original Household Register
Thai Military Record (for males)	<p>Letter from the Ministry of Defense listing dates of military service and confirming service, and/or letter from military saying the record is lost or destroyed. Contact your domicile's Military Registrar for obtaining a replacement letter if you lost this record.</p>
Proof of custody of a minor child (under 18) from the court	<p>-A Child Maintenance Certificate and Listing Sections 1546 and 1547 for out-of-wedlock child. This certificate can be obtained at a local district where the requesting parent has his/her official house registration, or</p> <p>-Consent from the other biological parent, along with the parent's Thai ID and original signature on the copy of the ID, and all name change certificates (if any). This consent must be signed either at the U.S. Embassy Bangkok on the visa interview day, or at a local district or Amphoe where his/her domicile, or at a notary public or Thai Embassy or Consulate if he/she is abroad. Proof of marital/single status from district registration office	<p>Family Registration Extract. This document can be obtained at any local district or Amphoe (since this information is online).</p>
All old passports to show entry/exit immigration records	<p>Thai Immigration Record. This record can be obtained at Thai Immigration Bureau. For instruction on how to obtain this document, please go to this link and see FAQ #14.</p>
Foreign police certificates for places of residence where lived for 12 months or longer after age 16	<p>Proof that you were of good moral character when you resided there. If the police certificate is not obtainable from the local authorities, you must present other convincing evidence that you are not ineligible to receive a visa or letter from the embassy stating that the police certificate is unobtainable.</p>
