

The list of documents and forms required for the interview at the U.S. embassy:

- Your passport, travel document and/or picture identity card;
- 10 front-view, passport-sized, color photos (5 cm X 5 cm) signed on the back with your last and first name for each visa applicant, detailed photo requirements are attached;
- Original and copy of the birth certificate;
- Original and copy of the marriage certificate;
- Original and copy of the death certificate or divorce decree issued by a civil authority for each of your and your spouse's previous marriages;
- Evidence of your legal name change, issued by a civil authority – original and copy;
- Certified copy of the adoption decree and/or certified copy of the court order granting custody, if applicable;
- Medical examination conducted by panel physicians ;
- Family photographs, correspondence, or any other personal documentation establishing your relationship to your petitioning relative in the United States;
- Current address, phone number and e-mail address (if available) of the petitioner in the United States;
- Your current address, phone number, and e-mail address (if available);
- Completed Form I-765, *Application for Employment Authorization*;
- Completed Form G-325c, *Biographic Information*; (all beneficiaries 14 and older)
- Completed Form I-590, *Registration for Classification as Refugee*;
- G-646, Sworn Statement of Refugee Applying for admission to the United States (concerning grounds of exclusion)
- Completed Form I-94, *Arrival/Departure Record*;
- Completed Notice of Pre-Departure Marriage and Declaration; (all beneficiary children 14 and older)
- Completed Notice of Duty to Register with U.S. Selective Service System;
- Any other documents you would like the officer to consider in your case.

The applicants are required to bring original and photocopies of all original documents. No fee is required or charged to process Form I-730 applications at this Office.

Upon completion of all requirements, the applicants are issued Transportation Letter by this Office to facilitate their entry into the United States. Such letter is placed in the passport.
