Security Message for U.S. Citizens:

Protests in Brussels

April 30, 2015.

The U.S. Embassy Brussels informs all U.S. citizens that following protests are expected in Brussels. Police will maintain order.

On April 30, 2015 from 11:00 to 13:00 hours a protest of the South African Community for Human Rights is organized in front of the South African Embassy (in green on map) Approximately 100 people are expected to participate. Local police will be present.

Also on April 30, 2015 from 14:00 to 16:00 hours, the Congolese Community for Human Rights will protest in front of the Congolese Embassy near Place Luxembourg (in blue on map). Approximately 100 people are expected to participate. Local police will be present.

On April 30 from 13:00 to 17:00 hours a commemoration of the Vietnam War/Fall of Saigon by the Vietnamese Community will be held at Place Schuman (in red on map).

On April 30 from 17:00 to 18:30 hours a protest of Moroccan Berbers Community for human rights will be organized at Place Schuman (in red on map). Approximately 400 people are expected to participate. Local police will be present.

Demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. You should avoid areas of demonstrations, and exercise caution if in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations.

We strongly recommend that U.S. citizens traveling to or residing in Belgium enroll in the Department of State's [Smart Traveler Enrollment Program \(STEP\)](#). STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates, and makes it easier for the U.S. embassy or nearest U.S. consulate to contact you in an emergency. If you don't have Internet access, enroll directly with the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.
