

UNITED STATES EMBASSY BRUSSELS. BELGIUM Security Message

for U.S. Citizens:

Protest March in Brussels

September 9 and 12, 2015

The U.S. Embassy Brussels informs all U.S. citizens that the following protest march is expected in Brussels. Police will maintain order.

On September 9, 2015 from 18:00 to 20:00 hours the “Sans Papiers’ refugees, economic and political fugitives will hold their weekly protest march for legal status, registration and paperwork. The march starts at the Place de Brouckere and ends on La Bourse, pedestrian zone. (in blue on map). Approximately 100 people are expected to participate. Local police will be present.

On September 12 from 11:00 to 13:00 hours the On the European Day of Action for refugees, the “Sans Papiers” refugees economic and political fugitives will march from North station via La Bourse to Place Sainte-Catherine (in red on map). Approximately 500 people are expected to participate. Local police will be present.

Demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. You should avoid areas of demonstrations, and exercise caution if in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations.

We strongly recommend that U.S. citizens traveling to or residing in Belgium enroll in the Department of State’s [Smart Traveler Enrollment Program \(STEP\)](#). STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates, and makes it easier for the U.S. embassy or nearest U.S. consulate to contact you in an emergency. If you don’t have Internet access, enroll directly with the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.
