

The President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief – PEPFAR Vietnam



Under PEPFAR, Vietnam received more than \$409.6 millions from 2004 to 2010 to support comprehensive HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment and care programs.

Partnership to Fight HIV/AIDS

The U.S. Government (USG) works in partnership with the Government of Vietnam to implement comprehensive HIV prevention, treatment and care programs in line with the National Strategic Plan on HIV/AIDS Prevention and Control for 2004-2010 with a Vision to 2020. The USG is in the process of developing a Partnership Framework Agreement with Vietnam for a five-year strategy for HIV/AIDS. The new strategy will continue to support prevention, care and treatment for HIV/AIDS but will increase its focus on sustainability and capacity building.



The USG Response in Vietnam

- Assisting Vietnam to develop comprehensive models of HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment, care and support networks;
- Supporting the Government of Vietnam’s efforts to reduce stigma and discrimination against people living with and affected by HIV;
- Advocating for greater involvement of people living with HIV (PLHIV) at all levels of HIV/AIDS program development, implementation and monitoring of HIV/AIDS programs;
- Training Vietnamese physicians in clinical HIV/AIDS treatment and care;

- Assisting the Ministry of Health to develop peer outreach for at-risk populations, HIV counseling and testing sites, and outpatient clinics in 40 provinces while others cover the remaining 23 provinces;
- Increasing the public health management capacity of Vietnamese government workers;
- Assisting the Ministry of Health to develop a national HIV reference laboratory, including quality assurance and quality control systems;
- Assisting in development of a treatment and care coordination unit within the Ministry of Health; and
- Providing support in establishing one national surveillance and monitoring and evaluation system.
