Charges for consular services are as follows:

Passport Renewals:

Adult \$110.00

Child \$105.00

First-time adult applicants \$135.00

Notarials:

\$50.00 per seal

Reports of Birth:

\$100.00

To ensure adequate time and smooth processing, we encourage you to:

- Review in advance the information on [passports](#) and [reports of birth abroad](#).
- Complete (but don't sign) your passport applications in advance to the extent possible.
- Provide exact change in US Dollars.
- For applications for children's passports or reports of birth, the parents and child must appear before the Vice Consul in person.

We hope to see you in Mongu.

We strongly recommend that U.S. citizens traveling to or residing in Zambia enroll in the [Department of State's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program \(STEP\)](#) at www.Travel.State.Gov. STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates, and makes it easier for the U.S. Embassy to contact you in an emergency. If you don't have Internet access, enroll directly with the nearest U.S. Embassy.
