**Political Unrest – Livingstone**

Zambian media is reporting that political party activists have engaged in limited violent clashes in Livingstone. U.S. citizens in Zambia are reminded there is a potential for violence in Livingstone and surrounding areas leading up to and immediately following the parliamentary bi-election on February 28, 2013.

We remind U.S. citizens that even peaceful demonstrations can turn confrontational and possibly escalate into violence. We urge U.S. citizens to, therefore, avoid all areas of demonstrations and to exercise caution if within the vicinity of demonstrations. U.S. citizens should stay current with news media coverage of local events and be aware of their surroundings at all times.

It is important during enrollment or updating of information to include your current phone number and current email address where you can be reached in case of an emergency.
