## **Audio System in DCM HOUSE Scope of Work**

A.1.1

### **History**

Embassy of the United States of America would like to hire services of a company who deals in supplying, configuring, installing, and maintaining a complete audio system which would be used for presentations and public addressing in one of their facilities. The new audio system should include the Digital Class Amplifier, Signal Processor, Full Range Speakers, Equipment Rack, Connectors, if required. The embassy requires the company to perform an initial survey of the house and give a proposal for implementation of a complete functioning new state of the art audio system infrastructure.

### **Scope of Work**

The scope of this work entails the following:

1. Inspect location; Contractor shall identify audio requirements for the Embassy that includes future expansion.
2. The speakers of new system should be wireless / Wi-Fi compatible e.g. Sonos Play:5
3. There will be 4 rooms in which speakers need to be installed. Speakers for each room should have both independent and common control.
4. The new system speakers should have capability to use as a PA system.
5. The new system should be able to add new speakers in future (expansion capabilities).
6. The new speaker system should have capability to connect at least 3 external wireless mics.
7. The new system should be able to provide digital quality audio signal.
8. Power plug / strips used in rack should be Universal Plug / multi pin.
9. Rack of new system should be properly planned and look professional.
10. The new system should also be supported to all the video formats in case of any video songs to be played.
11. The new system should be able to play music with various inputs such as Ministereo (3.5 mm), RCA , HDMI, Bluetooth and USB.
12. The new system and all its various components (Digital Class Amplifier, Signal Processor, Full Range Speakers, Equipment Rack, Connectors, Cables and others) used should be a reputed brand such as Bose, JBL, Bryston or equivalent.
13. Contractor shall provide all necessary equipment required to install and commission the new system.
14. The system should be able to support future increase in the number of audio input channels from presently being used.
15. Contractor should be able to provide on call maintenance on-site service support within 24 hours free of cost for the period of one year.
16. Contractor shall provide on-site service support on a chargeable per call basis after the initial year as needed.
17. Contractor shall provide warranty services for the equipment per agreement with the Embassy.
18. Contractor shall provide training to Embassy technical staff for upkeep and administration.
19. Contractor shall provide complete documentation with diagrams, labeling, service manual, operation manuals, including other materials needed to operate and maintain the system by embassy personnel at the time of commissioning the new system as part of completion of the installation.

(a) The Contractor shall comply with the Department of State (DOS) Personal Identification Card Issuance Procedures for all employees performing under this contract who require frequent and continuing access to DOS facilities, or information systems. The Contractor shall insert this clause in all subcontracts when the subcontractor's employees will require frequent and continuing access to DOS facilities, or information systems.
