


PEPFAR Funding in Mozambique
(\$US Millions)



PEPFAR represents the largest commitment by any nation to combat a single disease internationally. PEPFAR investments help alleviate suffering from other diseases across the global health spectrum such as malaria, TB and maternal and child health. PEPFAR is driven by a shared responsibility amongst USG agencies, the Government of Mozambique, and donor and partner nations. The PEPFAR program is proud to support the work of the National Acceleration Plan for incorporated universal treatment access for TB/HIV co-infected patients, universal Option B+ for pregnant women and universal treatment access for children < age five.



The PEPFAR program in Mozambique supports the global priorities set forth in the AIDS Free Generation policy while concurrently partnering with the Government of Mozambique’s National Accelerated Response to HIV/AIDS by: increasing the percentage of eligible adults and children with advanced HIV infection who receive antiretroviral therapy to 73%; increasing the percentage of HIV-positive pregnant women who receive ARVs to 90%; and increasing the percentage of adult males circumcised in target provinces to 80%. The Acceleration Plan prioritizes high-impact interventions and geographic areas, while focusing on a continuum of response by addressing key and vulnerable populations.



The U.S. President’s Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) proudly supports Mozambique’s fight against HIV/AIDS. With an adult HIV prevalence rate of **11.5%**, Mozambique is one of PEPFAR’s 15 priority countries. To date, Mozambique has received approximately **\$1.9 billion** in PEPFAR funding and works closely with the Government in response to treating current infections and combating the spread of HIV/AIDS.

- The PEPFAR program in Mozambique received its first set of funds in 2004.
- PEPFAR works in all 11 provinces of Mozambique and with 92 partners throughout the country.
- The PEPFAR Mozambique program aims to promote country ownership and improve sustainability and effectiveness by working directly with the government, non-government entities, civil society and local institutions.
- Mozambique is one of three GBVI (Global Based Violence Initiative) recipient countries and works with 21 partners to combat violence against women, children and men.

PEPFAR Mozambique supports Mozambique's National Strategic Plan through the Partnership Framework Implementation Plan. The Governments of Mozambique and the United States collaborate to strengthen Mozambique's national HIV/AIDS response through the following principles: government commitment and ownership, coordination, decentralization, health system strengthening, transparency, accountability and results-based management.

PEPFAR implementation is managed by committed American and Mozambican technical staff from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), the Department of State (DOS), the Department of Defense (DOD), and staff and volunteers of the U.S. Peace Corps (PC). Together with hundreds of local and international partners across Mozambique, men and women work to prevent new infections, provide treatment to those already ill, and support those affected by HIV and AIDS.

PEPFAR Mozambique is strategically aligned with the Global Health Initiative (GHI), which has a core focus on health outcomes for women and girls. In conjunction with PEPFAR programs already in place, the GHI strategy aims to reduce maternal, neonatal, and child mortality by focusing on the empowerment of women and their health.

In FY14 PEPFAR-supported activities in all 11 provinces of Mozambique achieved the following results:

- Anti-retroviral therapy (ART) for **365,051** individuals
- 129,581** voluntary medical male circumcision procedures
- Anti-retroviral prophylaxis for **88,512** pregnant women to prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV
- HIV testing and counseling for more than **2.7 million** people
- Care and support to **876,098** Mozambicans, including **170,227** orphans and vulnerable children
- Training for greater than **6,944** community health workers
- Direct support to **465** treatment sites, **858** PMTCT sites and **31** male circumcision
