Austrian Citizens

The rules for various Austrian passports are complex. In general:

- Austrian e-passports issued to adults on or after June 16, 2006, with an integrated computer chip and a digital photo (as opposed to a photograph that is glued or laminated into the passport) are valid for travel under the VWP until the date on which they expire.
- Austrian passports issued or extended between October 26, 2005 and June 15, 2006 are not valid for travel under the VWP. Holders of such passports require a visa to travel to the United States. Passports containing the previously used "Vignette" are not longer valid for travel under the VWP, since the validity of the "Vignettes" expired on October 26, 2006.
- Austrian machine readable passports (including children's passports) issued prior to October 26, 2005 are valid for travel under the VWP until the date on which they expire.
- Individual children's passport issued between June 16, 2006 and October 25, 2006 are valid for travel until the date on which they expire.
- Children's e-passports issued on or after October 26, 2006 with an integrated computer chip are valid for travel under the VWP.
- Machine-readable Austrian **temporary, emergency, diplomatic and official passports** are valid for VWP travel regardless of the date of issuance. The only requirement is that your passport must be machine readable.
- Children included in a parent's passport will require a visa to travel to the United States.



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

Passport issued 26 October 2006 and beyond

Any passport issued or renewed/extended on or after October 26, 2006 must be an "e-Passport" for the VWP traveler to be eligible to enter the United States visa-free. Most VWP countries are producing e-Passports well ahead of this deadline.

An e-Passport has an integrated computer chip that holds the same information printed on the passport's data page. These e-Passports must comply with international technical standards established by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO). You can identify an e-Passport with the symbol below on the passport cover:



Biometric passport requirement

Citizens of the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Slovakia and the Republic of Korea must be in possession of an "electronic passport" to enter the United States visa free under the VWP.

Business Visit

For the purpose of the Visa Waiver Program, "business" generally refers to business activities other than the performance of skilled or unskilled labor. Examples of activities that are allowed include:

- engaging in international commercial transactions, which do not involve gainful employment in the United States (such as a merchant who takes orders in the U.S. for goods manufactured abroad, or who travels to the U.S. to purchase American-made goods for export from the U.S.);
- negotiating contracts;
- consulting with business associates; and
- participating in scientific, educational, professional or business conventions, conferences, or seminars.

The performance of any skilled or unskilled labor - even if it is unpaid - is most always prohibited. This includes performing work in the U.S. as a trainer or consultant.

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Transit

Travelers who meet all other criteria for visa free travel under the Visa Waiver Program are eligible to transit through the United States.

If transiting the United States to a destination in Canada, Mexico or the adjacent islands, the traveler may re-enter the United States on the return journey, using any mode of transport, as long as the total visit (including both periods of time spent in transit and in Canada, Mexico or the adjacent islands) does not exceed 90 days.

If transiting to a destination outside of Canada, Mexico, or the adjacent islands, the return journey must be on a qualifying Visa Waiver Program signatory carrier (most major air and sea lines) but need **not** be within 90 days, as the traveler will be required to make a new application for admission.

Travelers transiting the United States to take up residence in Mexico, Canada, Bermuda or the Caribbean Islands must be legal permanent residents of these areas.

Arrests & Convictions

Some applicants are uncertain how to answer the question, "have you ever been arrested?"

In general, minor motoring offenses outside the U.S. that were disposed of by paying a ticket by mail have no bearing on admission to the United States. Travelers with minor traffic offenses that did not result in their arrest and/or conviction for the offense may travel visa free, provided they are otherwise qualified. If you are not sure whether or not you are eligible to travel visa free, the only way to resolve this question would be to apply for a visa.

If a traffic offense occurred while you were in the United States, and you have an outstanding fine against you, or if you did not attend your court hearing, it is possible there may be a warrant out for your arrest and you will experience significant problems when applying for admission at the U.S. port of entry. The Embassy cannot assist you in this regard. You must resolve the issue before traveling, by contacting the court where you were to appear. Conclusion

Important reminder: Neither possession of a visa, nor meeting the basic requirements for traveling visa-free on the VWP, guarantees admission to the United States. As with most countries, the final determination of admissibility is made by immigration officials at the port of entry. Visa-free travel does not include those who plan to study, work, or remain more than 90 days. Such travelers need visas. If an immigration official has reason to believe that a visa-free traveler is going to study, work or remain longer than 90 days, or has misrepresented facts regarding his or her travel, the officer is authorized to refuse admission to the U.S.

Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA)

International travelers who are seeking to travel to the United States under the Visa Waiver Program (VWP) are required to obtain travel authorization under the Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA) prior to boarding the air or sea carrier to the United States. Travelers who do not receive travel authorization prior to their departure may be denied boarding, experience delays or be denied admission into the United States. Applications may be submitted at any time prior to travel, but no less than 72 hours prior to departure. If your registration is successful, it will be valid for multiple applications for two years or until the date on which your passport expires, whichever comes first.

Before going on line to register, you should ensure that you are qualified to travel under the Visa Waiver Program otherwise your registration will be rejected. ESTA only authorizes a traveler to board an air or sea carrier for travel to the United States. It also does not guarantee entry into the United States; that decision rests with the immigration official at the Port of Entry in the same way that travelers currently entering the U.S. under the Visa Waiver Program or with a visa are subject to inspection.

Entering the United States by land

Travelers who make their initial entry into the U.S. by land from either Canada or Mexico are NOT required to travel authorization through ESTA before traveling.

Warning

If your passport was ever been reported lost or stolen to the authorities and then recovered, please do not attempt to use it for travel to the United States. If you input the passport details into ESTA, your application will be denied.

Unqualified Passport
