Security Message for U.S. Citizens: Demonstrations
July 25, 2014

The U.S. Embassy in Dakar informs U.S. citizens that demonstrations are expected to take place from the Big Mosque of Dakar, near the Round Point RTS, to Place de l'Obelisque around 1400 on Friday, July 25th. The Senegalese Muslim brotherhood will be demonstrating with the stated purpose of supporting the Palestinian population and protesting the Israeli bombings of the Gaza strip.

Even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. You should avoid areas of demonstrations, and exercise caution if in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations.

We strongly recommend that U.S. citizens traveling to or residing in Senegal or Guinea-Bissau enroll in the [Department of State's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program \(STEP\)](#). STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates, and makes it easier for the U.S. embassy or nearest U.S. consulate to contact you in an emergency. If you don't have Internet access, enroll directly with the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.
