## **FIANCÉ(E) VISA INTERVIEW**

You will have received an appointment letter confirming the date and time that you are required to appear at the Embassy for the visa interview, which you are required to present to the Security Guard in order to be admitted. Please double-check the date and time of your appointment. You will not be admitted more than 30 minutes prior to the time shown and arriving too late may result in the cancellation of your appointment. You can expect to be at the Embassy for approximately two to three hours. A map showing the Embassy's location can be found on our website at - <http://london.usembassy.gov/location.html>. Important information concerning security requirements at the Embassy is available from [http://london.usembassy.gov/visas\\_security.html](http://london.usembassy.gov/visas_security.html). If you fail to follow these security requirements you may face delays or cancellations to your visit.

Appointments will be changed only for **urgent** reasons. A request to reschedule an appointment must be stated in writing and forwarded to the address above. Please note that a visa is usually valid for travel to the United States for six months from the date of issuance.

### **PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING**

No assurance can be given in advance that a visa will be issued to you. A decision cannot be reached as to your eligibility under the law to receive a visa until after your medical examination has been successfully completed, all your documents have been reviewed and found to be in order, and a consular officer has interviewed you. Therefore, you should **NOT** take any irrevocable steps or make final travel arrangements until you receive your visa. The visa is usually valid for travel for a period of six months from the date of issuance and you must marry your U.S. citizen fiancé/e within 90 days of your arrival in the United States.

This office will process your interview as quickly as possible on the day of your visa appointment, but it is a process that will take two to three hours. Once the interview is complete, you will be free to leave the Embassy.

The Embassy will not maintain copies of your documents. If your issued visa is destroyed, lost or otherwise rendered useless, you must present the original or certified copies of all supporting documents before we can reissue the visa or you can be admitted to the United States.

### **DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR THE INTERVIEW**

A list of documents required on the day of the interview can be found at the following website reference - [http://london.usembassy.gov/application\\_documents.html](http://london.usembassy.gov/application_documents.html). All documents, except passports and photographs, must be submitted **in single copy**, with the original. If you have only the original of your birth, marriage and/or other certificates you may submit a photocopy but **you must bring the original(s) with you** for inspection by the consular officer. The original(s) will only be returned to you if you furnish one copy in addition to the original.

It is your responsibility to document or correct any biographic discrepancies such as your name

in your passport or birth certificate. All corrections must be made before your visa interview. Failure to do this may prevent us from processing your application for a fiancée visa to a conclusion on the day of the interview.

## Medical Examination

Your medical results will be sent directly to the Embassy by Knightsbridge Doctors and will take approximately **5 workdays** from the date of the examination to be received.

If you have not yet arranged an appointment for your medical examination, you should do so immediately as the medical examination must take place before the visa interview. Please visit <http://london.usembassy.gov/immigrant-visas/medical-examination.html> for further information. You will require your case number in order to book the medical examination.

If you attend the Embassy without having attended the medical examination, the interview will be cancelled and you will be required to reschedule for a later date.

## CHILDREN

Children under the age of 14 who are applying for visas at the same time as the parent are not required to attend the interview. You may bring their documents with you. They require a passport, if they are not included on your passport, two photographs and a birth certificate. Children aged 14 and over must attend the interview. All children, regardless of age, require a medical examination.

## VISA APPLICATION FEES AND RETURNING YOUR DOCUMENTS

All fiancé visa applicants and their children who will be immigrating with them to the United States, are required to pay a non-refundable visa application fee of \$240 per person, regardless of age. The fee **MUST** be paid before you attend the appointment.

The fee is paid by following these simple steps:

1. Visit <http://dld.bz/ivbook> and select "Apply for a K Visa"
2. Sign up for a user account
3. Select "Add Applicant" to provide information about yourself. Repeat this step for each person who will apply for a K visa with you.
4. Choose where you want your documents to be sent if your application is successful. Delivery to a regional center in the UK will not incur additional costs.
5. Pay the MRV fee of \$240.00. Payment must be made by MasterCard or Visa debit card. Once you have paid the fee, you can request home delivery from the courier for a fee of \$30 per applicant. If you wish to select home delivery, you can do so by returning to your profile once you have paid the fee. Please note that you can **only** select Home Delivery up until the day **before** your interview.
6. Confirm your facility (select U.S. Embassy London).
7. Please **DO NOT** submit any documents ahead of your interview. You should present all documents at the time of your appointment.

You may wish to bring the appointment letter with you as confirmation at the time of your appointment.
